

Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation Names Goss and Burns to Board

The two newest members of the Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation Board, Robert Burns and John Goss, were introduced at the April 18 ODKF volunteer's luncheon.

Burns is a community member and Goss is an OCC member.

The board is now complete at 15 members, with 10 members belonging to the Outrigger and five representing the local community.

Robert Kalikolehua Burns is described as an "activist" helping to protect the sport of surfing. Organizing the Hawaii Surfing Industry Association was this local boy's way of getting involved with ocean management of surf activities.

He began his business, Local Motion, in 1978 in Kailua, where he graduated from high school, and now has a staff

of over 75. The business won the 1988 Governor's Cup for Specialty Store of the Year and again in 1990 for Manufacturer of the Year--Export Market.

One of his surfboards was the "star" of the Woody Allen-Bette Midler movie, *Scenes From the Mall*.

Local Motion shops were the pickup point for ODKF Scholarship applications this year. The newest director is helping ODKF make waves.

John Goss, when asked to submit a brief resume, handed in 10 pages, a man of many talents, with a hand in the operations of many organizations. As a business analyst, he has served as a court appointed trustee for several companies, CEO or president of several others, and now tries to have fun as the current president of the Outrigger Canoe Club.

John's roots in Hawaii go back to the 1832 arrival in Molokai of his mission-

ary ancestor Harvey Rexford Hitchcock. He says his sports involvement began at age two when he learned to swim. He now cites mountain climbing as a major interest and has some major expeditions to his credit.
