Finals for the meet have been set for November 28-29.

Early indications are that surf will be running high at the famous surfing site this year.

Arrivals from Australia, Peru and possibly several other nations are expected to arrive soon to work out in the heavy surf.

The annual event has attracted tremendous crowds in the past. Hundreds actually migrate as early as Friday afternoon in order to camp on the beach

and tie down a ringside seat.

More than 20,000 have been forecast to line the shores during the four day world surfing championships.

Pageantry has been scheduled for all four days, including the selection of a Hawaiian beauty to reign as Queen of the International Championships.

Numerous Outrigger members are expected to participate. In the past, the Outrigger Beach Service members have walked off with some of the top honors, though not under the club's banners.

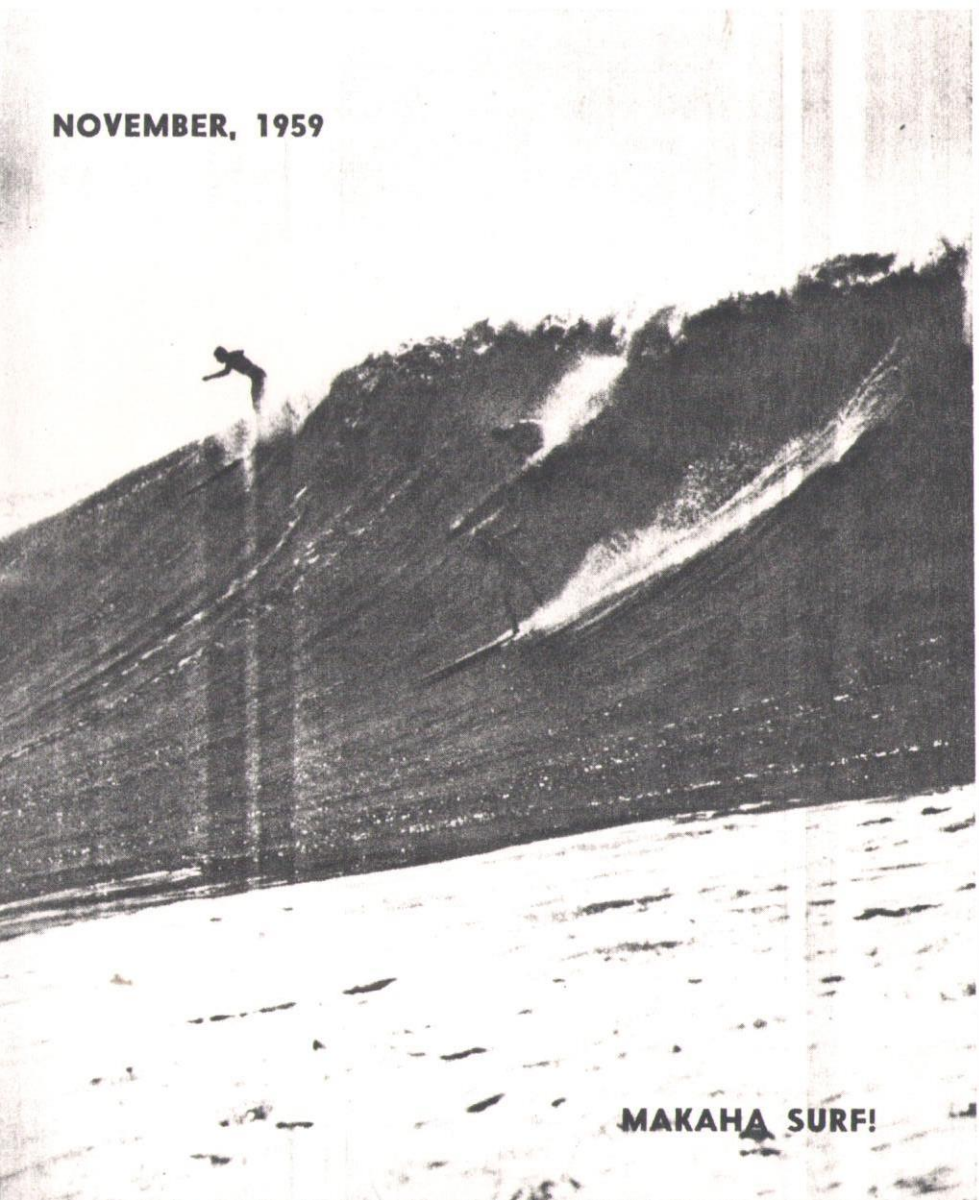
