## OCC TEAM TOUGH CONTENDER IN STATE VOLLEYBALL CHAMPIONSHIPS; HOGAN TO TOKYO FOR OLYMPICS

The OCC team and Central YMCA collided for top position in the recent State Volleyball Championships.
