Dear Tommy:


I have been informed by Cline Mann, Club Captain, that he was authorized by the board on January 27 to hire a volleyball coach at a salary set at \$300 for the volleyball season. Inasmuch as I have been designated the coach by the club captain, I wish to express to the board my desire to serve in this capacity without pay. I am motivated for two reasons: first, as a player for many years I received the benefit of several trips to the Nationals made by our teams, and second, I wish to show my appreciation to the board for the consideration given me regarding my indebtedness to the club which, I am happy to say, has now been entirely wiped out.

You will remember that at the volleyball meeting in January which you and other board members attended, I elaborated on the great potential we have in achieving our goal of winning national championships and landing at least one Outrigger member on the American team in the 1968 Olympics. I wish to reiterate that it is not our intention to ask the board to assist in sending our team to the Nationals unless it is our firm belief that our team has an excellent chance to win.

I cordially invite you and other board members to attend our practice sessions at the Mid-Pacific Institute gym on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 5:30 to 7 p.m. and afterward on the same evenings at the University of Hawaii gym where we are competing in the U H Round Robin during the month of March.

The recent letter from Gene Selznick, who is probably the best volleyball player in the country, deserves careful consideration; however, time is of the essence. I certainly hope your Athletic Sponsors Committee can meet soon to draft some plans for financing if such is needed.
