

HAPPY HOUR : The House Committee submitted a recommendation that "Happy Hour" prices be reinstated on Friday evenings. During a spirited discussion on the subject it was stated that the directors are sensitive to the desires of the membership but that the present schedule for Happy Hour prices was only recently approved by the directors after thoughtful consideration and that it had not been in effect long enough to properly evaluate the results. Accordingly, Mr. Avery moved, and it was duly seconded and carried, that the present Happy Hour schedule be continued for another sixty days before considering a change.

DELINQUENCIES: Mr. Van Dorn presented a draft of a letter that he proposed to send to members whose names have appeared on the delinquent list twice this year. The proposal received unanimous approval.

WATER SAFETY : Several recent aquatic incidents involving club members and/or property were reported to illustrate the desirability for improved supervision over the beach-front activities; also a formal program for water safety.

Mr. Van Dorn was requested to explore the possibility of hiring a life guard to be on duty during weekends, holidays, and throughout the summer period. He was further requested to consult with Red Cross officials and other appropriate parties in order to develop a formal program to insure adequate water safety measures. The results of Mr. Van Dorn's efforts will be reported back to the directors for further action.

PARKING AREA : The problems associated with rain water in the parking area were also discussed. It was agreed that the Buildings and Grounds Committee be asked to study the water handling problem and submit a proposed solution.

In the meantime, the manager will institute appropriate procedures for his staff in order to reduce the possibility of hazardous conditions in the area when it rains.

ORRESPONDENCE : The contents of a letter addressed to the president Thomas Arnott from Regular member Ronald Sorrell was distributed for information. Said letter of acceptance of the position of volleyball coach without renumeration is attached to and made a part of these minutes. The president will acknowledge the letter and extend the gratitude of the directors.

Woollett : A letter from Regular member W. Woollett dated March 15, 1966 was submitted for discussion. Mr. Woollett protested the increase in overnight parking fees. It was decided that the secretary would acknowledge Mr. Woollett's letter and point out to him that the privilege of overnight parking must be limited to the extent that it does not disenfranchise the general membership from use of the parking facilities during normal operating hours.

ADJOURNMENT : The meeting was adjourned at 6:10 p.m.
