formance.

Our team journeyed to Detroit on April 28 to play in the National A.A.U. Volleyball Championships. In this tournament we played Fresno, Olympic Club of San Francisco and finally beat West Side Jewish Center Los Angeles in a double final to win the National A.A.U. Championship. This was the first Hawaiian team ever to win a National A.A.U. team title. Needless to say, we were all very happy. Particularly outstanding in this tournament were our young players i.e., Dodge Parker and Mike Holmes. They both showed that they have "arrived" as national level players.

Three days later we played in the U.S.W.B.A. Championships and met Fresno (the eventual winner) in our second match, we lost in three very close games thus entering the losers' bracket. Our final standing was fifth in this tournament.
