ALL HOBIE CATS!!!

We have six more point races left to determine the Hawaii Hobie Cat champion for 1969. One race will be held August 17, two races August 23, and the last three races August 24. This will total seven point races (the first one was held August 10). Each participant will take his best five races to determine his final point standing. Points are awarded as follows: 1st place, $\frac{3}{4}$ point, 2nd place, 2 points, 3rd place, 3 points, 4th place, 4 points, etc.

Please be sure to obtain the official Hobie Cat 14 racing rules from McWayne Marine Supply if you do not already have a copy of them. Starting with the August 17 race, these rules will be strictly adhered to. Any violation of these rules, as well as general sailboat racing rules, could result in a protest and subsequent disqualification.

Starting times, location of race, and course will be posted at McWayne's as well as the Outrigger Canoe Club.

The August 10th race had 15 entries, the course was 8 miles. The winner was **Keoni Warinner** followed by **Lieth Anderson**. The August 17th races was run over the same course with 18 boats entered and the first and second place winners were exactly as before, **Keoni Warinner** and **Lieth Anderson**.

These races are being held to see who will represent Hawaii and Outrigger at the Nationals to be held at San Diego the first week of September.

Early this year in April, **Keoni Warinner** represented the Outrigger as well as the State of Hawaii at the Lake Havasu, Arizona sailing championships. **Keoni** took his newly acquired Hobie Cat from **Poche** in Southern California as the guest of **Hobie Alter** and **Wayne Schafer**. Forty-three Hobie Cats were entered (quite a fleet) and **Keoni** placed ninth over all.

"The lake is just beautiful and the competition fierce," he states. "Winds are a bit lighter than in Hawaii, but they hold more steady. I'll be back up there next year for sure."
