How 16 OCC Members fared in the Makaha Foundation Benefit Run

When this Fall's Makaha Foundation Benefit Run was held on September 28th last, sixteen Outrigger Canoe Club members were among the 387 participants who tackled the 8.3-mile grind around Kapiolani Park, through Kahala and back around Diamond Head. Most of the runners were members of the Honolulu Marathon Clinic, of which the Club's Dr. Jack Scaff and Fred Hemmings, Jr., are directors. Each entrant donated \$5 to the State's organ tissue fund.

Notable among Outrigger Club participants in the benefit affair was Dr. George Starbuck, one of the oldest entrants. He has survived two coronaries and was this year named one of the most improved runners in the Marathon Clinic. Another outstanding Club participant was Jan Newhart, who won first place in the Women-45 group. Her time was nearly three minutes faster than that of the woman who won first place in the 20-29 age group.
