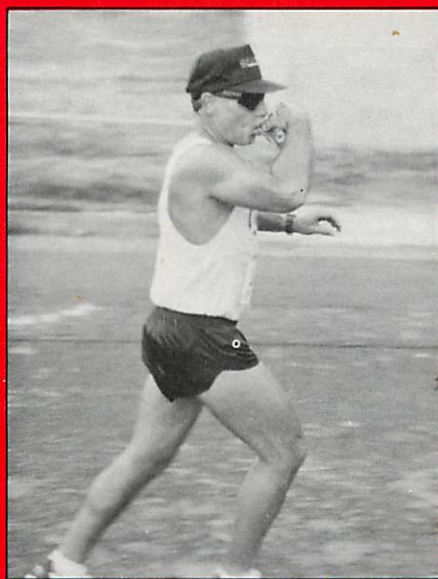
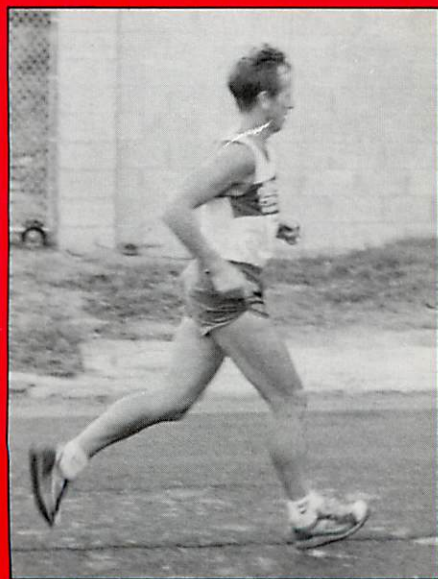

1986 Honolulu Marathon

Twenty-seven Outrigger members were among the 10,000-plus runners in the 1986 Honolulu Marathon on Sunday, December 7.

The Club's first finisher was veteran marathon runner Max Telford in 3:04. Telford was eighth in his 50-54 age group among all Marathon finishers.

Bill Danford was only six minutes behind at 3:10.

Gay Balding was the Club's first woman finisher in 3:13. Gay was third in her marathon age group, 25-29, and finished sixth of all Hawaii women entered in the race.

For the first time, the Running Committee gave awards to the top Club finishers in the following categories: First to Finish, Male and Female and first male and female finisher in the following categories — 34 and Under, 35-44 and 45 and Over.

The winners of the Club awards were:

- First to Finish: Max Telford and Gay Balding
- Male 34 and Under: Jim Beardmore
- Female 34 and Under: Anne Perry
- Male 35-44: Bill Danford
- Female 35-44: Carole Wilbur
- Male 45 and Over: Jim Stahl

Outrigger's youngest runner was Balding at 25 and the oldest was Ken Brown at 56.

For Beardmore and Anne Perry it was their first marathon. The other

Club runners are all veterans of the 26-mile race.

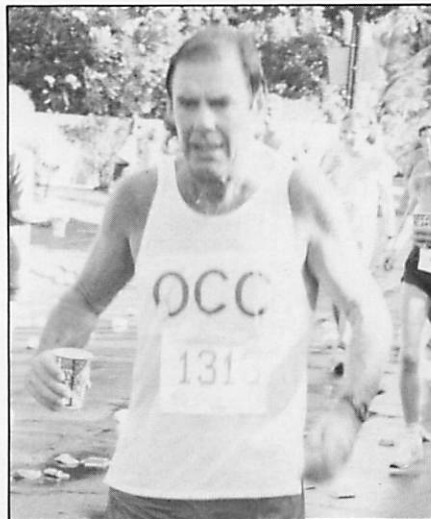

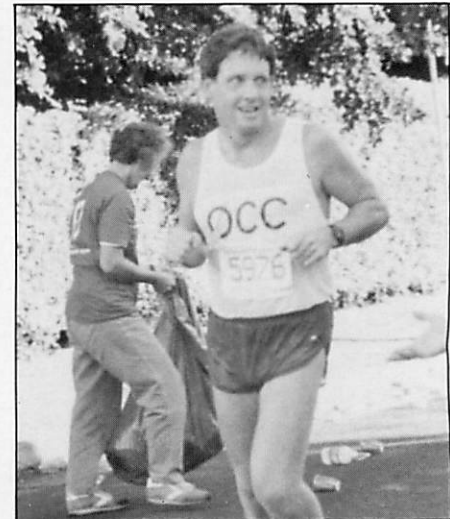
Jack Meyers was timed in 3:30.

Jim Stahl ran the marathon in 3:26.



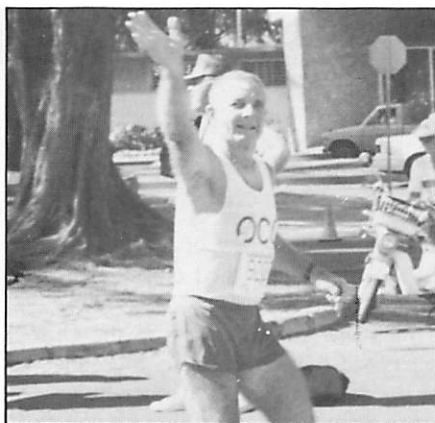
Jimmy Dean turned in a 3:35.

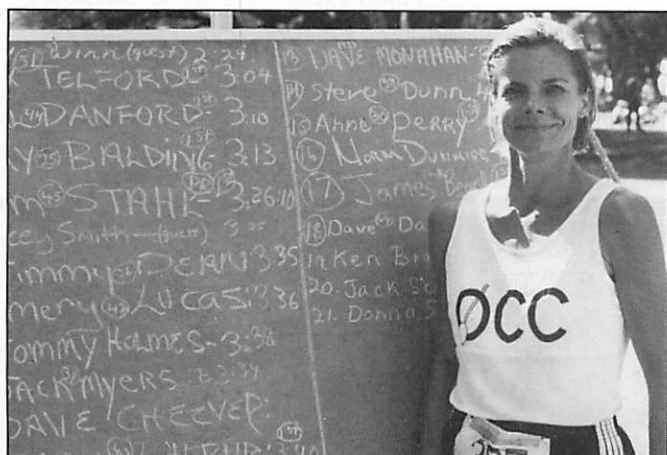

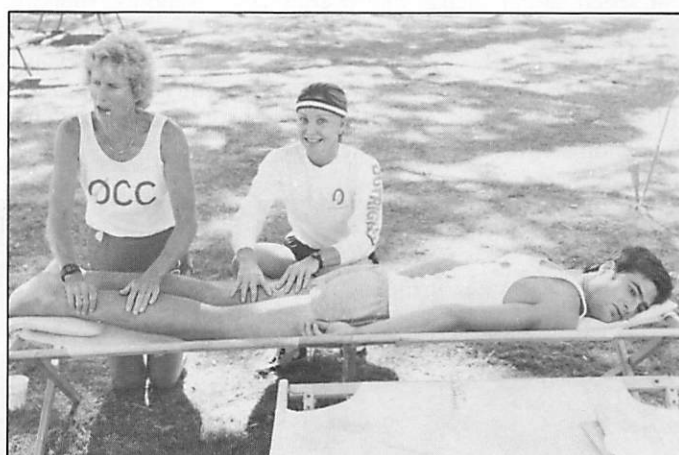

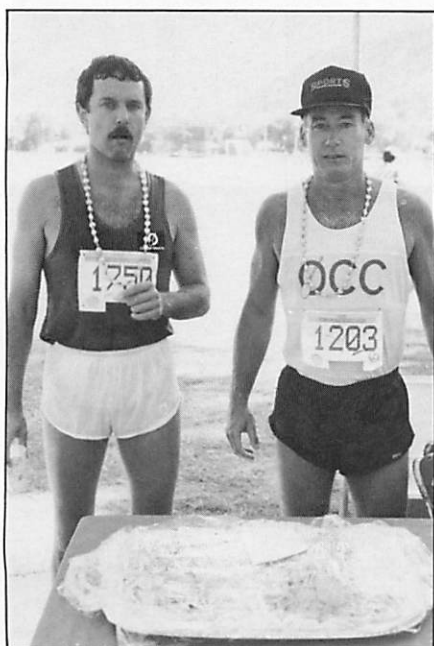

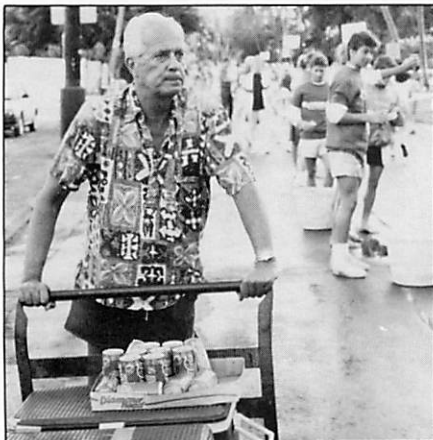
Reassurance, reassurance, reassurance. Sponge, water, Coke.

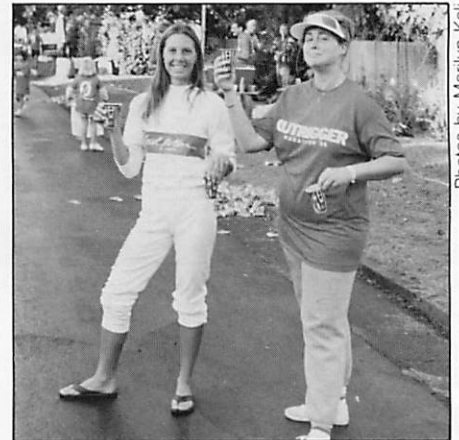

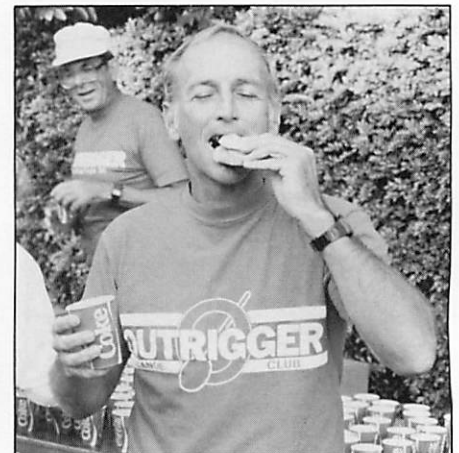

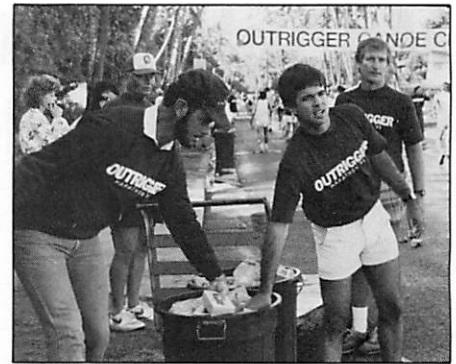

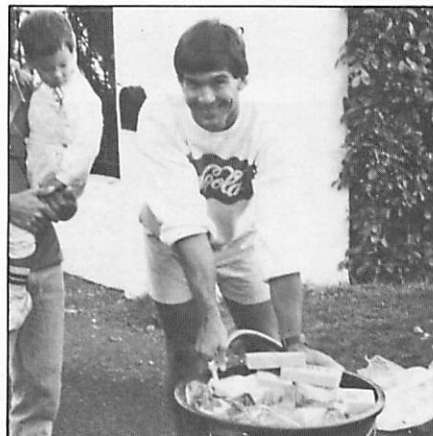

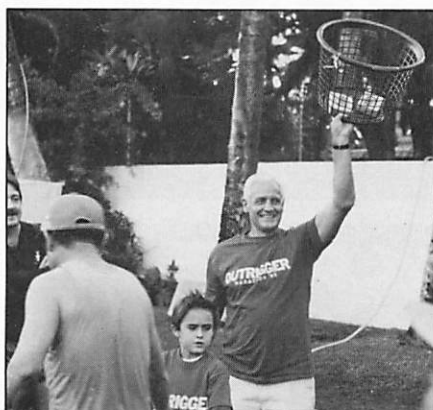
