

Golf Chips From the 19th Hole

1991 Rules of Golf

Golf Chairman Jim Hammons passed out copies of the 1991 Rules of Golf and Slope Reference booklets at the annual meeting and awards banquet in January and the Stroke Play Tournaments in February and April.

OCC Golfers who have not received their copies may telephone Hammons at 922-3481 and arrange to obtain their copies.

These official booklets are the bibles for all play. For example, do you know the action to be taken when a player fails to hole out on a hole in stroke play?

- If the player does not correct the mistake before teeing off for the next hole, the player is disqualified.
- If the player realizes the violation has occurred or the violation is called to

the player's attention before leaving the green, the player may a) replace the ball where it was originally at rest, hole out and add a one-stroke penalty, or b) place the ball in a different place and putt out, adding a two-stroke penalty.

- If the player discovers the error after leaving the green but before teeing off for the next hole, the player may

proceed as above.

- If the player and opponent agree to overlook the player's failure to hole out, both are disqualified.

Chairman Hammons is making an effort to bring the quality of Outrigger golf up to professional standard insofar as the Rules of Golf are concerned. He urges all OCC Golfers to familiarize themselves with them.
