The third 1991 Stroke Play Tournament will be held on Wednesday, July 3, at Leilehua Golf Course.

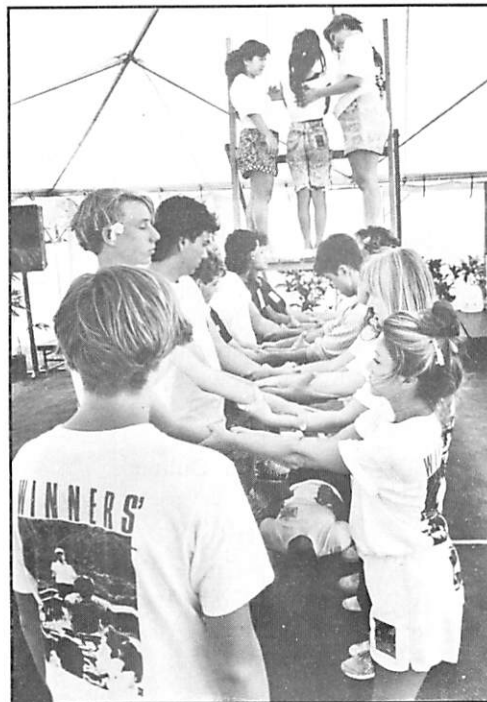
