

# Golf Chips From the 19th Hole

Outrigger golfers were welcomed with near perfect weather, a course in great shape and a supportive staff for their first Stroke-Play tournament of 1992 at Navy-Marine Golf Course on February 7.

Competition was keen, particularly with the women with Joie Gopez and Terri Lui carding identical 90s for Low Gross and 70s for Low Net.

Joie's 90 included a two-stroke penalty for playing the wrong ball. Terri was determined the winner by matching cards. Ties are broken by matching cards on 1) the last nine holes, 2) the last six, 3) last three, and 4) last hole.

Golf Chairman Jim Hammons incurred a similar penalty in a freak incident on the 10th hole when his ball struck a palm tree and two balls fell to the ground. Unfortunately, he played the wrong ball (probably the one with the best lie?) and also suffered a two-stroke penalty.

Bill Cross was the Men's Low Gross winner with a fine 78, followed by Terry Stoddard's 82.

Vic Hawthorne (68) and Larry Langley (69) were Men's Low Net winners while Joie Gopez (77) won the Women's Low Net.

Terri Lui rounded out a fine day of golf by winning both Closest-to-the Pin awards for the women, while Jim Hammons and Larry Langley each won one of the men's Closest-to-the-Pin prizes.
