## Molokai Hoe record stands

Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association officials decided last night that no crews will be penalized for alleged infractions in Sunday's Bankoh Molokai Hoe canoe race. The decision means Lanikai Canoe Club officially set the course record of 4 hours, 53 minutes and 3 seconds in winning the 40.8-mile race from Molokai to Oahu.

"The standings will stay as they were reported, and Lanikai's record will stand," said Joan Malama, Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association president.

Race officials said Sunday that at least 10 of the record 92 canoes had made crew changes before the designated time of 30 minutes into the race. A 10-minute penalty would have been tacked on to the finish time of the crews found guilty of the infraction.

Had the penalty been imposed, Lanikai still would have won, but would have lost its record. There also would have been a shuffle among other top finishers, with Waikiki Surf Club replacing twotime defending champion Faaa of Tahiti as the second-place team.
