

# OUTRIGGER CLUB HAS ADDITION

## Allan Herbert Presents a Grass House to the Woman's Auxiliary.

In a cozy little grass-house, presented by Allan Herbert, the members of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Outrigger Club will serve tea this afternoon at Waikiki. This will be the inauguration of the new club, or, rather, the first function to be given under the auspices of the Woman's Auxiliary of the old Outrigger Club. Of late there has been unusual activity among the women who desire the right kind of a place for their children and themselves at the beach, and the result is that they now have a splendid little home near the Outrigger quarters which is "their very own."

Yesterday afternoon the finishing touches to the new home of the ladies' division were put on, and this afternoon the members will be on hand in goodly numbers to celebrate. The place is indeed very pretty, situated as it is on the banks of the lagoon, near the large pavilion on the water, which the ladies have been granted the use of. Mrs. F. M. Swanzy has been instrumental in organizing the ladies' section of the club, and she has been elected its president.

From now on there will be a regular schedule of affairs on the beach, for the feminine members of the Outrigger Club have arranged things in the right manner. On school days there will be some lady belonging to the club at the grass-house from 2 o'clock until 6 every afternoon to act as chaperon for the girls who like to go in bathing. The Woman's Auxiliary will keep open-house all day Saturday and on all holidays, except Sunday, when the members may have the use of the house if they desire.

Some six months ago Alexander Hume Ford attempted to form a woman's auxiliary to the club, but at that time the project was not a success. There were only nine ladies then who signified their intention of joining. But now the Woman's Auxiliary of the Outrigger Club is apparently stronger than the main organization. There are between forty and fifty active members, and they are all taking a deep interest in the work. A preliminary meeting was held some time ago, when a constitution and by-laws were drawn up. Then officers were elected, who, besides the president, Mrs. Swanzy, are as follows: First vice president, Mrs. H. M. von Holt; second vice president, Mrs. J. H. Soper; secretary, Mrs. G. P. Wilder; and treasurer, Mrs. S. G. Wilder. There are seven trustees, who, with the five officers above named, constitute the Board of Directors. The trustees are Mrs. Ivers, Mrs. Eben Low, Mrs. E. I. Spalding, Mrs. F. A. Schaefer, Mrs. Ralph Forster, Mrs. Laura Wight and Mrs. George R. Carter.

Altogether the club has about thirty chaperones who will act during the coming months. Anyone who wishes to join the club should send in her name to the secretary, by whom it will be brought before the Board of Directors and voted upon. The annual fee is \$5 for each member. Girls under ten years of age and boys under six years are allowed to accompany their parents.
