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both in the canoe and on the surfboard. A white lad was the first to win a cup at a carnival of surf-riders, and a "hapa-haole" (half-white) is today the most graceful surfboard rider, and by long odds the best helmsmen of a Hawaiian outrigger-canoe.

The Outrigger Canoe Club has been organized solely to revive and popularize the Hawaiian water sports that have made these islands famous the world over. The dues are but five dollars a year, which entitles members to all privileges, including the use of canoes, surfboards and the bath-rooms. It is hoped by the officers of the club that neither the boys nor girls of Hawaii, will ever permit the club to languish or the art of surfing to become a lost art. Only in Hawaii do adults and children stand upon the crests or the waves, like gods, so let the world come to Hawaii where this may be done, and may there always be those at Waikiki who will gladly initiate the malihini into the delights of surfing as it is done by all real kamaainas (old 24 timers.)
