

BIDDELL WILL DO LIFE-SAVING STUNTS

W. H. Biddell, the Australian life-saving expert and champion swimmer, will give an exhibition of his art at the Healani Boat Club tomorrow morning at ten o'clock. There will be, of course, no admission charged and the upper lanai of the club will be absolutely reserved for the use of ladies who wish to see the exhibition. For the mere men things there will be plenty of room on the float and on the end of the Channel wharf.

Mr. Biddell, who is staying in Honolulu for his health, has made himself a favorite in local aquatic circles by his evident knowledge of the life-saving game. He has been a welcome guest at the Outrigger Club and he will give his performance tomorrow at the express invitation of the Healani Boat Club.

Amongst other stunts, Mr. Biddell will give an exposition of the Schaeffer method of resuscitation of the apparently drowned, of loosening a drowning person's grip, of rescuing a drowning man in full street attire, of rescuing two drowning people, one on each arm and a number of other interesting and exceedingly useful stunts.

Mr. Biddell is a life member and governor of the Royal Life-Saving Society and has saved many drowning people in different parts of the world. His art is one that is comparatively easily learned by expert swimmers and he can show what everybody ought to know, even with one exhibition. His work tomorrow will be watched with keen interest by all the local water-dogs.
