FROM SAN FRANCISCO WITH A  
LARGE MAIL.

A bit later than usual the S. S. Alameda from San Francisco docked at the Oceanic wharf this morning at 10 o'clock.

She brought 64 cabin and sixteen steerage passengers. Her cargo consisted of 750 tons and there were 256 sacks of mail aboard.

Among the freight were three automobiles and a valuable horse.

The first day out from San Francisco the weather was very cold but it soon warmed up and the trip, on the whole, was a pleasant one.

Among the passengers was Alexander Hume Ford, the aquatic enthusiast who comes to revive the Outrigger Club and to superintend the regatta to be held at Waikiki in connection with the Clark tourists arriving this month by the S. S. Cleveland.
