

Biggest Steamer That Ever Entered Here

The 18,000 ton liner Cleveland of the Hamburg-American line is due here from Yokohama on the morning of Sunday, the 23rd inst.

On board the Cleveland is the Clark tourist party consisting of more than 700 passengers, who have made the trip on the liner from New York by way of Europe and the far east. The steamer called at Madeira, Gibraltar, Naples, Port Said, Suez, Bombay, Colombo, Calcutta, Rangoon, Singapore, Java, Borneo, Manila, Hongkong, Nagasaki, Kobe and Yokohama.

The Cleveland will leave San Francisco on February 5 and will call at most of the ports visited on the outward voyage and will land passengers at Southampton, where they will make passage for New York on some other ship of the same line. For the return trip 762 passengers have been booked.

The Cleveland will be the largest and most pretentious vessel that has ever visited this port. The great liner is commanded by Captain Dempwolf and differs in personnel from the liners to which Honolulu is accustomed in carrying two second officers, two surgeons, three chief stewards and three assistant chief stewards.

Among the passengers nearly every state in the union is represented. The majority of the passengers are persons of wealth, and the local hotels and storekeepers expect to do a humming business while the vessel is in port.

The Cleveland left Yokohama yesterday, will arrive at daylight on the 23rd inst. and will leave for San Francisco at 5 p. m. the following day. On her return trip she will arrive on

Feb. 12, and will depart for Yokohama at 5 p. m. on the 3th inst.

The vessel will be met outside by the tug Intrepid carrying the Hawaiian band. The members of the Promotion Committee will also go out to the steamer in their own launch.

On the wharf a corps of young ladies will distribute leis among the visitors.

Among the amusements planned for the entertainment of the tourists is a regatta at Waikiki held under the auspices of the Outrigger Club, and for which an attractive program of surf sports has been arranged.

Among the passengers of the Cleveland are Dr. F. E. Clark and forty Christian Endeavorers. Dr. Clark is the founder of the organization and he and his associates are returning home after having attended the world's convention in India.

The Endeavorers will be extensively entertained by the local societies and a special launch will be chartered for the purpose of taking local Endeavorers out to greet their fellow members. Religious services have been planned in which the visitors will take part and an elaborate luncheon will be given in their honor by the local societies.
