

SURFING STUNTS ON SUNDAY NEXT

Outrigger Experts to Disport
Themselves for Clark
Excursionists.

The Outrigger boys are preparing for the arrival of the Clark excursionists next Sunday. It was decided at a meeting of the committee of arrangements yesterday to confine the aquatic sports next Sunday afternoon to surfing stunts. The judges will be stationed at the end of the Moana pier and will judge the surf riding. All kinds of fancy surfing will be indulged in, the boys will be given an hour in which to show how far they can go on a wave, how erectly they can stand and what gymnastic feats they can accomplish on the board. Many of the boys can stand on their heads on the surfboard, and there are those who can ride in pairs on a single board. All of these will be given opportunities to show off, and the one who makes the best all round record will be awarded one of the Clark surfboard cups.

The surf boat contests will also take place next Sunday afternoon, the same judges will award one of the Clark cups to the boat crew that brings its boat furthest before the wave in a straight line toward the beach. Every member of the Outrigger Club is hoping for big surf next Sunday, but big surf or little surf, the events will take

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place and the members, junior and senior, are urged to make immediate entry and spend the week in practise.

On Saturday, February 12, Mr. Clark will arrive with the second ship load of cruisers, the canoe races and general regatta will then take place, as well as a repetition of the surfing contests. The big hundred-dollar silver engraved cups will then be contested for. These will, however, go to the winners only for the year, they must win these cups three times to call it their own for all time. Needless to say every surfer in the Outrigger Club has hopes. Other events for the water carnival are in contemplation, Harold Hustace, the world's surfboard champion, challenges any boy of his own size to race him, he on his surfboard, the other boy in an outrigger canoe.

Members of the club wishing to take part in the surfing contests next Sunday afternoon are requested to enter their names at once. They will find

someone at the club grounds every afternoon to give any desired information.
