

# OUTRIGGERS ADOPT RULES FOR PRIZES

The first gathering of the new directorate of the Outrigger Club was called to order yesterday afternoon at the office of Treasurer F. T. P. Waterhouse by President Sanford B. Dole. Judge Weaver, Ralph Lyon, A. H. Ford and Secretary G. N. Tuttle were also present. The new constitution and by-laws were discussed and it was suggested that at an early date an amendment be made giving the directorate enlarged powers in the matter of appropriating the funds of the club for improvements. The plans of the house committee for making needed improvements in the matter of larger lanais and lounging places as well as providing a club restaurant were approved. The interests of the youngsters will not be neglected by the directors. Club Capt. Kenneth Brown was appointed as a committee of one with power to add two others, to pull off, on Saturday afternoon, March 18, the twice delayed Clark Cup surfing contest.

The directors hope that the ladies will also compete and they have adopted rulings for the cups that should bring out every amateur lover of surfing sports of every kind. Boards, big and little canoes will all be encouraged to enter the contests.

Following is the decision of the board of directors concerning the Clark Cups: "The Clark Cups shall be kept by the Outrigger Club as perpetual trophies to stimulate the sport of surfing, the cups to be contested for annually, each year the respective winners having their names engraved on the cups."

"One of the Clark Cups engraved with illustration of surfboarding shall be held for an annual contest among men and boys on the surfboard, the other for a similar contest among the girls of the Auxiliary."

"One of the Clark Cups engraved

with illustration of surfboarding shall be held for annual contest of surfing in small outrigger canoes, and the other for surfers in large canoes. The winning steerer in either event to have his name engraved on the cup. Any active member of the Outrigger Club may compete in any of these events."

Active members are construed as those who since the annual meeting on February 14 when the new constitution and by-laws were adopted have permanently given up paddling for profit. The Amateur Athletic Union will be communicated with and professional slips prior to February 15 in all probability wiped out so far as Outrigger members are concerned.

The proofs of the constitution and by-laws were approved and the booklets presented by Mr. Chas. Crane of the Commercial Advertiser will soon be mailed to each member of the club.
