

OUTRIGGER CLUB IS

READY FOR SHOW



Big Stunts on Grounds and Much Doing on Waves — Illuminated Procession of Canoes.

Henry McRae will have a stage at the Outrigger grounds on June 10 larger than that of the Opera House; some of the scenery from the Opera House will be moved to the beach, and there will be a real vaudeville performance. The McRae scenery is 26 feet wide by 18 feet high, but this does not stagger the entertainment committee of the Outrigger Club. Work will be commenced immediately on the big stage, to say nothing of a few select private boxes, which may be engaged in advance.

The vaudeville will be free to all ticket-holders, the stage being so located that the devourers of ice cream under the hau trees will have a clear view. The turns will come off between dances, and it is but a step from the Outrigger dancing lanai to the open-air auditorium of the Outrigger-McRae theater.

Work has also been begun on the dozen attractive booths over which the ladies will preside; the big new dancing floor over the lagoon has been completed, and the cocoanut columns to support the roof are now going up. The members of the club are busy practising in the surf for the events of June 10 and preparing for the big illuminated parade of canoes, scheduled for Kamehameha eve.

The carnival is still two weeks off, but much of the work of preparation is well under way, and new plans are developing daily as the enthusiasm spreads. The events at Waikiki on June 10 are likely to draw a record-breaking crowd to the popular grounds of the Outrigger Club.
