Gault, and the Hawaiian Association Football, by Mr. Fiddes. Among the clubs and colleges to be canvassed by the committee of four are:

The Chinese Athletic Club, Oahu College, McKinley High School, St. Louis College, the Hawaiian Gun Club, the Honolulu Rifle Club, the Beretania Tennis Club, the Pacific Tennis Club, the Manoa Tennis Club, the Hawaii Yacht Club, the Honolulu Yacht Club, the Oahu Country Club, the Honolulu Golf Club and the Kunalu Rowing Club.

Mr. Super moved that all the clubs be organized as the Hawaiian Amateur Athletic Association and that the Pacific branch of the Union be joined in that name. This was carried, and Lorrin Andrews was given three weeks time in order to communicate with Major Peixotto.

A motion directing Lorrin Andrews to appoint a committee of three to draft the constitution and by-laws was carried unanimously, and Andrews will do so in a day or so. Great enthusiasm was shown in the amateur union proposition, and there is no doubt that the clubs that were represented at the meeting will never have much trouble over professionalism.
