

# GREAT STUNTS FOR KAMEHAMEHA EVE

ILLUMINATED CANOES  
WILL BE FINE SIGHT

Clark Cups to Be Contested For—  
Vaudeville Show on Big Stage  
—Dancing on Lanai—Surfboard  
Stunts by Youngsters.

The Outrigger Canoe Club is all ready for its series of stunts on Kamehameha eve. The sport will begin about 3:30 p. m., and it's dollars to doughnuts—or paddles—that they keep up until a. m. and the last extra car. There will be the youngster's regatta in the afternoon, beginning with a canoe sailing race in which Eddie Hutchinson and Eaton Magoon will try conclusions sailing against the waves and before them. Then there will be a three-paddle race for small boys, a canoe race in which the contestants in each canoe will be brothers, a race between surfboards and canoes, and, most exciting of all, the big six-paddle canoe race.

Eighteen boys from up mauka will man these canoes, most of them beginners, for the club has now entered upon a policy of encouraging the new pals to try their hands at bucking the waves and handling the paddle.

There will be a new course marked out—the Outrigger course—and it will not lead over shallow reefs or way down the beach out of sight of everyone. From the new enlarged Outrigger lanai the whole triangular course will be visible, and at no time will the racing canoes be beyond the vision of the spectators on the Outrigger grounds.

The big event of the afternoon will be the Clark cup surfing contest. There will be a cup for the best girl surfer, and one for the most skillful boy surfer in the club. There will also be a big silver Clark cup for the best canoe surfer; in fact, two cups for this event—one for big surfing canoes and one for small.

There will also be games in the surf, boys standing on boards and spearing inflated bladders, and boys in canoes jousting with long bamboo canes. All this to give the youngsters an appetite for the chowder that is served from 5 to 8 o'clock. At 7:30, however, the boys who are to propel the canoes in the carnival will report at Lower beach and at 8 sharp the procession of illuminated canoes will start down the beach to the Outrigger grounds. The canoes, gay with lanterns, will be dragged over the beach and anchored in the lagoon.

Just as soon as the canoeists get on their bathing suits, the dancing will begin at both hotels and at the Outrigger Club. Between dances on the big Outrigger lanai there will be a series of vaudeville turns on the big thirty-foot stage built for the occasion. Expert surfboarders will be sent out to the big rollers during the evening with powerful distress signal sticks that, attached to the bow of a surfboard and lighted, bring out the athletic body of the standing surfer as clear as day.
