

FULL PROGRAM FOR FRIDAY

TWELVE EVENTS TO
BE BROUGHT OFF

Canoes and Surfboards Will Vie With One Another on Rolling Breakers—Vaudeville Show Will Be Good.

On Friday afternoon the water sports at the Outrigger Club will start early and everything is in readiness for the different stunts that are to be brought off. The full program as arranged is as follows:

- 1—Sailing race, at 3 p. m.
- 2—Three-paddle race for boys.
- 3—One-paddle race for boys.
- 4—Five-paddle canoe-surfboard race.
- 6—Six-paddle canoe race.
- 6—Jousting in canoes.
- 7—Brothers teams canoe race.
- 8—Girls' surfboard contest for Clark Cup.
- 9—Surfing in large canoes for Clark Cup.
- 10—Surfing in small canoes for Clark Cup.
- 11—Boys' surfing contest for Clark Cup.
- 12—Surfing polo.

At 5 o'clock the visitors and contestants will sit down to chowder in the big lanai of the Outrigger Club. At 7 o'clock the canoes will all be paddled down to Lowers beach, where they will be decorated with lanterns and return in procession at 8 p. m.

After the illuminated parade some of the lighted canoes will go out surfing, and the experts with the signal torches on their surfboards will come in riding on the breakers.

Some time before 9 p. m. the bands and orchestras will break forth at the hotels and on the Outrigger grounds, and the dancing will begin.

The vaudeville stunts will come off on the big stage near the Outrigger lanai. They will be sandwiched between the dances.

The electricians are now at work on the lights for Kamehameha Eve, and the ladies are arranging their booths under the groves of hau trees on the Outrigger grounds.

Mrs. Carl du Roi and Mrs. J. R. Galt will take charge of the ice cream arrangements; Mrs. Charles Booth and Mrs. A. Gartley, the soft drinks; Miss Newcomb and Miss Fuller, the coffee; Mrs. Raymond Brown, candy; Mrs. Dr. Ewbank, jam and tea; Miss Emma Lyons, flowers; and Mrs. G. H. Tuttle, the club booth.

The chowder, dances and entertainment will all be entirely free to ticket-holders. Col. Soper will assume charge of the grounds for the evening, while Lorrin Andrews will start the water carnival, and G. H. Tuttle will be lord high commissioner over the whole affair.
