JULY FOURTH AT WAIKIKI

CLUB PLANS FINE

PROGRAM AT BEACH

**Royals Will Give Show on Lanai—
Clark Cups to Be Contested For
—Illuminated Canoes to Ride
the Breakers.**

The Outrigger Club will not let the Fourth go by without a big celebration. There will be events in the surf, an invitation extended to Secretary Dickinson, and a dramatic performance during the evening in the big lanai.

The Royals will have charge of the evening show, and they have organized a large company that will give its first performance on the evening of the Fourth in the Outrigger lanai.

A stage is being built and several sets of scenery will be used in the big production. There will be a minstrel show to start with, then vaudeville and a one-act play.

After that the entire company will lead the cake walk out into the open, where the great cake will be contested for.

While this is going on, the big hall will be cleared for dancing.

The hall, by the way, is bigger than ever. It is now 80 by 56 feet, the addition being added this week to give place for a mosquito-proof cloak-room and for a gymnasium, where Lorrin Andrews' huskies will be organized and made ready to go in training for the racing events.

Two of the Clark cups will be contested for on the afternoon of the Fourth—both for canoe surfing.

It is probable that several of the crack amateurs in the club will challenge Short, the winner of the Clark cup for amateur surfing, to show contests.

The Hui Nalu, an organization of the crack paddlers and surfers of Waikiki, will be engaged to go out on the night of the Fourth and give an exhibition of illuminated surfing. Secretary Dickenson will have enough to keep him busy sightseeing at Waikiki all afternoon, and evening of the Fourth, and Royal has a dramatic patriotic surprise for the secretary that will startle him—as it will the people of Honolulu.
