SURFING CONTESTS

Canoes Will Go Out to Win Clark Cup—Minstrel and Vaudeville Follow.

The Outrigger Club will give Secretary Dickinson a Royal reception at Waikiki on the Fourth of July. There are still two of the Clark cups to be contested for and the Royals are busy organizing a strong company of twenty people to give a great show at the Outrigger lanai on the evening of the Fourth, with a dance to follow. Royal and his wife, Miss Elliott, are as enthusiastic as any member of the Outrigger Club, and they will present with their company a Carnival of Mirth. The Art Theater is lending three sets of scenery, and a stage will be built at one end of the big lanai. The full company of twenty or more members will open with a great song and dance minstrel show, then there will be a vaudeville program and a one-act play with the full strength of the company, and—last of all before the dance—the great cakewalk, free to all, but led by Royal's company, now under rehearsal. The cake walk will take place on the grounds, to give the workers a chance to clear the big hall for dancing.

The proceeds of the Royal show will be used to complete the Outrigger clubhouse and its gymnasium, both under course of construction and to be ready for occupancy on the Glorious Fourth.

Mr. Dickinson will be invited down to the club grounds to witness the Hawaiian water sports. In the afternoon there will be canoe racing and the contest in the big surf for the Clark cups for the best canoe surfers. There will be a contest first of small canoeing, two in each. The contesting crews will try their best in three different canoes, one after another, and the crew or paddler making the best average wins the Clark trophy for small canoe surfing. The large canoe crews will change canoes at least once, and expert judges will be on hand to mark the points.

In the evening the Hui Nalu will be engaged to go out into the surf with their boards illuminated by red fire torches, and come in surfing. The Hui Nalu is composed of the half-dozen crack paddlers and surfers who do not claim to be all amateurs. Dude Lemon is the Nui Nalu of the Hui Nalu, and with his crack organization out in the waves the people of Honolulu will see the real article in surfing.

The grounds and lagoon of the Outrigger Club will again be illuminated, and the colored lights will be carried over to the Young lawn, while the illuminated canoes will be decorated in the lagoon and remain there. There will be a prize for the best decorated canoe.

The Royals have some startling patriotic effects up their sleeve for their entertainment for the club on the Fourth, which they will not divulge in advance.
