

OUTRIGGER CREWS

PICKED FOR FOURTH

Jackies From Cruisers Cleveland and Chattanooga and Belgian Ship to Take Part.

The juniors and seniors at the Outrigger Club have picked their crews for the races on July 4, and the jackies of the Chattanooga, the Cleveland and the Belgian training ship L'Avenir have selected theirs. These are the six-paddle crews, and the Frank Speaight solid silver cup goes to the winner of the senior six-paddle event.

Lorrin Andrews will act as judge-in-chief and master of ceremonies at the regatta and in the surfing events for the Frank Clark cups. The house committee will hereafter organize the regatta's of the Outrigger Club, and Charles Crane will act as captain to select and train the crews. G. H. Tuttle has been made chairman of the house committee. Everyone will be given a chance to enter the races on the Fourth, the practised paddlers will help those who are not adepts to make up crews, and those who show likelihood of making good paddlers will be coached for future work.
