

TO ARRANGE PROGRAM FOR REGATTA EVENTS

**Native Crew From Kona, Hawaii,
Will Compete With Outrigger
Club Haoles in Canoes.**

The Hawaiian Rowing Association held a meeting Wednesday evening at the Healani Yacht and Boat Club, elected officers for the ensuing year and appointed a regatta committee to take charge of the aquatic events which are scheduled to come off on Saturday, the seventeenth of September. Tom V. King was reelected president of the association; Bert F. Heilbron was chosen vice-president to succeed A. F. Ewart, and Irwin Spalding was reelected secretary and treasurer.

Tom King, B. F. Heilbron and Irwin Spalding constitute the regatta committee which was appointed. This body will meet early next week to arrange the program for the regatta day sports, which will be the same as last year, with two exceptions, it was said yesterday. A year ago the naval fleet was in Hawaiian waters, and the crews from these warships participated. There will be no naval crews this year to compete.

A crew of native outrigger lads from Kona, Hawaii, will contest for honors with a crew of haoles from the Outrigger Club in a six-paddle race. In the struggle last year between a native crew and whites the latter beat the Hawaiians at their own sport, much to the latter's chagrin. The rivalry between the Hawaii boys and the Outrigger Club lads is very keen, it is said, and this event will be a go for blood. The Hawaii crew did not take part in the regatta day events last year. The native crews which competed came from the Kamehameha Aquatic Club and other local organizations.

The Healani and the Myrtle Club oarsmen are pulling themselves into form every night now in the harbor, and next week the speed trials will be in order. The Healanis expect their barge to be delivered today.
