

COMMITTEES O. K.'D AT A. A. U. MEETING

Registration Committee Also
Elected—Sunday Meets to
Be Discussed.

The second meeting of the board of management of the Hawaiian branch of the A. A. U. was held at Lorrin Andrew's rooms yesterday afternoon. President Tuttle put before the meeting the lists of committees he had prepared and these were ratified. The registration committee was also elected and the matter of Sunday meets discussed.

Besides the lists published below the members of the registration committee were elected. Tuttle said that this was the most important committee they had to appoint and it was necessary for the welfare of the Union that the men selected should be above any suspicion, and for that reason he had left the matter of the selection entirely in the hands of the board. The names had to be chosen from among the board, and finally John F. Soper, G. H. Tuttle and Paul Super, were selected.

The matter of a handicap committee, as also of Sunday meets, was held over until more of the clubs join, so that the expressions of all may be obtained on the subject.

The matter of showing their sympathy for young Ornellas' mother was also brought before the board and, although the members thought that something should be done, they did not see their way clear at the present juncture to give any financial aid. Finally it was fixed up that Lorrin Andrews should be appointed a committee of one to attend at the benefit and to speak of the sympathy that was felt by the Union.
