

THE DIRECTORS OF OUTRIGGER CLUB MEET

Important Matters Are Discussed
and Improvements Planned
—Much Enthusiasm.

The new directorate of the Outrigger Club held its first meeting yesterday afternoon in one of the grasshouses on the club grounds.

The work of constructing the new bathhouse addition was taken up with ardor. In fact, Allan Herbert, who is chairman of the house committee, has already begun the work of construction.
