

OUTRIGGER CLUB LAYS OUT AMBITIOUS YEAR'S PROGRAM



The Outrigger Club is coming back into its old rapid fire action. The committee on program of sports and entertainments for 1911 has reported an elaborate list of things to be done, which the directors have instructed the house committee to carry out.

The house committee will start the ball rolling this afternoon.

Those on the entertainment committee not on the house committee have been requested by the latter to continue work as members of a joint committee to carry out the program, and to enlist the aid of the ladies.

The first event to be carried through will be the big entertainment to raise funds for the needed permanent improvements on the grounds. The committee intends to net \$1000 for this work.

On the last big entertainment members subscribed for from five to twenty-five tickets each, and similar enthusiasm is being aroused for the 1911 program.

The following is the report adopted and ordered carried out by the board of directors:

"Gentlemen:—The house committee and the committee appointed by you on entertainments and an athletic program for 1911 have united as a joint working committee and beg to submit the following report and program for your approval:

"1. An entertainment to be given, consisting of native Hawaiian canoe sports by the men and women of the Kalihl Aquatic Club, they bringing their own canoes and poi pounders, baking taro Hawaiian style on the beach and pounding same into poi and loaning a pig; the men and women of the club to engage in canoe sailing and racing, surfboating if the surf permits. It is suggested that such an entertainment be made annual, during the tourist season, to be known as 'Malihini Day,' at the club, with a dance to the visitors in the evening.

"2. In the early spring it is proposed that the house committee and entertainment committee arrange for a carnival on the grounds of the club for the purpose of raising funds for the definite, fixed purposes herewith suggested: that this committee first secure a thousand signed subscriptions

to the tickets at \$1.00 each before the same are printed; that as the funds come in the board of directors instruct the treasurer to use these funds pro rata on the improvements for which the entertainment is given and on general expenses of the entertainment, and that this fund be used for no other purposes. The funds are to be expended on a permanent concrete wall, thatching and rethatching the lanai and grass houses, filling in, house moving, work on a new bathhouse for the women, a pergola entrance to the grounds, rock jetties and sandbagging to preserve the beach, a club room adjoining the large lanai, surfboards and paddies, and other necessary incidentals in the way of improving the grounds prior to the date set for the entertainment. The estimated expenses are as follows:

"Wall, \$375; thatch, \$100; filling, \$25; house moving, \$25; boards and paddies, \$25; women's bath house, \$150.00; pergola, \$50; club room, \$100; rocks and bags for beach, \$50; incidental improvements, \$100; cost of entertainment, \$200; total, \$1200.

"3. A joint ball with the other aquatic clubs on regatta day evening in the large lanai on the club grounds.

"4. A Halloween masquerade.

"5. A Christmas dance.

"The house and entertainment committees also recommend that two or three "get together" chowders be given at cost, in the lanai, to which the ladies of the auxiliary be invited by the men's club.

Athletics for 1911.

"Your committee suggests:

"1. An annual 'Malihini Day,' in February, consisting of Hawaiian sports and pastimes, on the grounds of the club and in the surf by native Hawaiians engaged for the occasion.

"2. On Kamehameha Day surfboarding and canoe races, with prizes or decorations to those who invent and carry out new surfing games or contests.

"3. On July 4, cup races, sailing, swimming and canoeing for the perpetual cups already in possession of the club.

"4. Canoe races in September for the juniors.

"5. Late in the fall a night carnival of sailing and canoeing with decorated canoes and fireworks from surfboards."

The house committee, with the retained members of the entertainment committee, will meet this afternoon at half-past four at the call of Chairman Allan Herbert.
