

AQUATIC CLUB PLANS CONTEST

The Kamehameha Aquatic Club proposes to pull off a regatta in Kaili harbor on June 12, at which five events will be contested, three canoe races and two sailing events. The ladies will open proceedings in a two-paddle canoe race, free-for-all, which is scheduled to commence at ten o'clock. A four-paddle canoe race for men will follow, and then comes the most important canoe race of the day, a six-paddle ancient canoe race for the championship of all-Hawaiian outriggers, over a half-mile course. Modern canoes will figure in the fourth event, a sailing race for the championship of all Hawaii, over a two and a half-mile course, and the day's sports will close with another sailing race for modern canoes over the same course as the preceding race.

Guests will be entertained at a luau, which will commence at noon

and will last for an hour. The function is one that promises well and should attract thousands of spectators, as it is probable that crews from the other islands will be here to compete in the various events.
