

# OUTRIGGER CLUB

## RACE JULY FOURTH

BEEN DROPPED—NEW DUES  
ARRANGED.

The Outrigger Club will put two canoes in the races on July Fourth. There was a full meeting of the club at the public service rooms yesterday afternoon and, after the objects for which the meeting had been called, were disposed of, the matter of the Fourth of July races was brought up by the delegate from the Kamehameha Aquatic Club; he wanted to know if his organization entered the A. A. U. would there be racing. Captain Melanphy held a hurried conversation with Kenneth Brown, and announced that there would be. After the meeting Kenneth Reidford announced that he and the Ukulele's would take one of the Wall canoes, after Brown's crew had had its pick. The mountain crew are betting that the first name of the captain of the winning crew will be Kenneth.

Dr. A. C. Wall stated that he would at once put his racing canoes, now at the Outrigger Club, in shape for the racing crews.

The Outrigger meeting was called to discuss the lowering of dues, and the dropping of the idea of incorporating the club. Both schemes carried. It was decided to lower the dues from ten to six dollars per year, payable in advance, and not to even discuss incorporation again until after the next election in January.

The house committee came in for severe criticism, and a desire expressed, that brought enthusiastic applause was that the house committee either attend to its duties, and become acquainted with them, or make place for those who have the interest of the club sufficiently at heart to hold and attend house committee meetings.

Only one member of this committee was present at the meeting. Mr. A. G. Smith, treasurer, promised, for the directors, that a new grip would be taken, and now that the long-awaited-for meeting had been held, new life would be infused into the club, and every officer and committee member would be compelled to show an active interest.

The meeting was lively and enthusiastic, and the members showed a determination to have their affairs administered in a progressive manner, and in this the directors kokuued.

There will probably be some shaking up of dried bones out at Waikiki now, and the house committee will have to go some if it does not want the captain and his crew to run away from it.

There are a handful of applications to be considered for membership under the new dues, and at a meeting of some of the officers after the big gathering it was determined to go in for a whooping campaign.
