

OUTRIGGER CLUB TO ENTER PADDLE RACES

ALL EVENTS WILL BE FOR THE
AMATEURS—GLORIOUS
FOURTH.

The Outrigger Club will probably enter four six-paddle canoes in the Fourth of July regatta in the harbor.

Kenneth Brown, with the picked kamaaina hoe boys of the club, will use Dr. A. C. Wall's racer, the Liokeokeo.

Kenneth Reidford and Marston Campbell have both made up crews and Frances Cooper hopes to get the Hue Nalu behind him.

The crews were all practising yesterday afternoon at Wiakiki, and the canoes will probably be paddled down to the harbor today.

Captain Ted Melanphy of the Outrigger Club will probably arrange for two six-paddle races, the youngsters of the club will pit their strength against the men if they have to, but as there are three canoe loads of youngsters, this makes a good racing proposition in itself, and it is understood that three of the Kalihi clubs will send canoes to compete with the senior outriggerites.

There will be no racing for money prizes as the Islands are now under the influence and protection of the A. A. U.

It should be a great Fourth for clean sports, and the Outrigger Club for two years has led in the movement for an A. A. U. branch in Hawaii.

Canoeing not coming under the A. A. U. jurisdiction, no one who takes people out surfing for money can be termed a professional, as the Hawaiian A. A. U. makes its own canoe rules and may never pass on this.

The sport will probably be kept open for all time for both Hawaiian and haole crews, only there will probably never again be a cash prize offered in Hawaii for canoe racing.
