GENERAL T. H. BLISS ON ARMY AUTO TRUCKS

After making several extensive experiments with automobile trucks for army use, General T. H. Bliss, commanding the provisional brigade at San Diego, reports their efficiency as being extremely high. He found that it cost much less to operate than the three escort wagons it replaced, and it also proved so much faster in getting over the ground than a team, that there was no comparison.

Tests with motor cycles by the troops resulted most favorably, and proved that the machines were thoroughly reliable and faster than horse or signaling ever thought of being.

General Bliss recommends his own design for auto trucks, constructed especially for rough army use.

TWENTY DAYS FOR AMENDED COMPLAINT
