

# AQUATIC MEET WILL

## ATTRACT BIG CROWD

### SPECTATORS TO BE SEATED ALONG DOCK—FIRST HAWAIIAN RECORDS.

Everything is in readiness for the aquatic meet of next Saturday, and the affair will be a memorable one for Hawaii. The first official records for the A. A. U. will be established and then Honolulu will be on the athletic map.

The swimming races are to be held at Bishop slip and the place is an ideal one for the purpose. Seats and chairs will be ranged along the dock and the spectators will be able to watch the races in comfort. A moderate charge will be made for the seats and the money derived from that source, will be devoted to purchasing medals and trophies with which to reward the victorious swimmers and divers.

The officials who will be in charge of the events are all experienced men, and the records will be carefully kept and registered. The amateurs are expected to put up some good times over all the different distances and from the fifty yard dash to the one mile swim it is thought that the events will be closely contested.

The aquatic meet is attracting a lot of attention and there are going to be some fine races. The Healanis and Myrtle clubs have some fast men, and there is great rivalry between the clubs. In fact something like the interest shown in the annual rowing races is being worked up, and that is a good sign. The Hui Nalu bunch will also have men in every event and the members of the new surf club are very keen on the proposition.

The Outrigger Club will also be represented and the members of that well-known organization feel that their names will figure prominently in the winning lists.

The blue ribbon event will be the 100 yards dash, and it will be interesting to see how the Honolulu swimmers compare with the natatorial experts of the rest of the world. There is little doubt but what the local swimmers will make good times over the different courses, and that the parent body of the A. A. U. will get a surprise when the Hawaiian records are forwarded to the mainland.

The diving contests should be good, also, and the men who seem able to take the water gracefully from any old height, will give the spectators thrills while performing their stunts.

The entries for the different events closed yesterday afternoon and no less than 120 names have been put down for the races. Of course most of the swimmers and divers have entered for more than one event and that has swelled the grand total.

The Myrtles have fifty units to work for them in the races; the Hui Nalu sports forty names, and the Healanis club has thirty men, good and true, to compete for the honors. The full list of entries is as follows:
