MANY TRIAL SPINS BY CON-
TESTANTS AND GOOD
TIMES MADE.

All sorts of impromptu tryouts were performed, and the members of the Healanis look very pleased with themselves. Tinker, of the Healanis is down for the plunge and 220 yards. For the relay race, L. Cunha, F. Kruger, W. Grace, R. Fuller, George Murray, J. P. Honan, A. E. Tinker, G. B. Beckert, C. E. Mayne and C. A. Broderick, of the Healanis, are entered.

The Outrigger Club has missed connections and will not be represented as a body at the aquatic meet. However, with the Myrtles, Healanis and Hui Nalu members on the job, besides the unattached members, there will be sport enough for anything.

The sports will start at two o'clock on Saturday afternoon and, by that hour there should be a big crowd of spectators present to see the races.
