

WATER SPORTS TO BE HELD DOWN AT ALAKEA SLIP

It was discovered yesterday that the Bishop slip would not be available for the aquatic meet of tomorrow, and it has been decided to hold the water sports in the slip alongside of the Alakea street wharf. There is plenty of room there, and the water is fine and deep.
