

REGATTA DAY TOMORROW SHOULD BE BEST OF YEARS

Entries Look Good to Followers of Sport--- Interesting Events Will Be Contested ---Puunene Entered for Juniors.

At last all the doubts about the crews that were touted to enter for different events on Regatta Day, have been set at rest, and the lists of crews that are to compete, are now complete. The one surprise is that the Puunene, Maui, crew has entered for both the Senior and Junior events. The Valley Islanders cannot take part in both races, so much speculation is being indulged in as to their intentions.

Puunene Juniors.

That the Puunene crew—with Hughes in it—will row senior is a certainty. With Hughes out of the boat—and he has been out for three afternoons—the crew is eligible for the Junior race, and it is said, on very good authority, that the Puunene crew will take part in the Junior event. There can be no objection to that course being taken, if the Maui men wish to row in the junior race. None of the crew, as constituted without Hughes, are anything but juniors, and there can be no kick coming on that score.

Good Entry List.

The entry lists look good to the people who like rowing, sailing and paddling. All the events should be closely contested and, as there are only the best rowers, sailors and paddlers on the list, there will be unconfined joy tomorrow on the harbor.

Many Invitations.

The Myrtles and Healani have "done themselves proud" on the proposition of entertaining their guests at the boat houses, and the way the invitations have been sent out, has made hundreds of sporting people happy.

For some years it was the custom to hold open house at the boat clubs, but abuses crept in, and it was found necessary to start the invitation and badge system. Only those people who wear badges will be allowed to enter the boat sheds tomorrow. All those fortunate ones who are decorated with the necessary ribbons, will receive a very cordial welcome from the members of the Myrtles, Healani and Puunene clubs.

Regatta Begins at Nine.

The first event will start at nine o'clock tomorrow morning, and it will be the whaleboat, four oar, event. A prize of \$20 will be given to the winners, and the race should be a good one.

The program will be continued from nine in the morning till about three in the afternoon. By the latter hour the full program should be about worked off, but there is no telling how long the sailing canoe races will take.

Fourteen Regular Events.

Fourteen events, in all, are to be contested, and they range from rowing races to all other sorts of contests. There should be one good time down on the waterfront tomorrow, and those unlucky ones who cannot attend the regatta, are to be pitied by the more fortunate ones.

There is one thing to be considered in every race and that is that, although confidence is a great thing, it may be carried too far, before a race, and develop into "swelled head"—and that commodity has lost many a race, both on horseback, on a bicycle and in a boat. The Healani Freshmen might remember that broken oars, crabs and other misfortunes happen at times to the best regulated crews.

New Healani Barge "Kulamann."

At a meeting of the Healani last night, the new barge of the club was christened the "Kulamann" and, if the crew that rows in her can attain

something like the speed of the well known launches of the same name, there will be little to the race in which the "Kulamann" is used.

For the whaleboat race, only two entries have been received and they are both from the same man—Tom Mahuka.
