

DUKE KAHANAMOKU MAY SWIM POMROY

Olympic Club Man Is Said to
Be Good Sprinter—Fine
Race Expected.

When the Olympic Club reaches Honolulu next month, the excitement among the baseball fans will only be equaled by that shown by the nautical artists. The advent of W. M. Pomroy as a swimmer in Hawaiian waters will be an epoch marking one, and the gallant young swimmer who swam across the Golden Gate, will be sure of a warm welcome to Honolulu.

The times put up by Kahanamoku have all been certified to, and sent on to the A. A. U. authorities. As soon as the news is received that the records have been accepted, Hawaii will be on the map for all time, as having produced a world beater.

The Hawaiian Association of the A. A. U. is now firmly established, and when the track and field meet of September 30, is over, there may be some running records to be sent to the Coast.

Bill Rice is sure to be in good form, and he should put up good times over the sprint distances. The only Bill is a fast man over the hundred yards and, if hard pushed, should knock a fifth of a second or so off his present record.
