

ANOTHER BENEFIT TO SWELL DUKE'S FUND

Sergeant Barry Plans Double-Header to Aid Champion Island Swimmer.

E. S. Barry, who is in charge of the athletic program for the entertainment of the Pacific fleet, announces that he will arrange a double-header between local and fleet teams for December 31, the proceeds of which will go into the fund needed to send Duke Kahanamoku into the Olympiad tryouts in New York next February.

"I want to see that fund brought up to the necessary mark," said Barry yesterday, "and the best way to do it is for everybody to lend a hand. I'm willing to do my part, and I guarantee two of the best baseball games ever seen here to the fans of Honolulu on the date of the benefit. The amount raised in the first benefit should at least be doubled on December 31."

Over \$2000 has been wagered to date on the outcome of the West Virginia-Colorado game to be played December 17. Rivalry is particularly intense as the winner of the game will be given a chance to go up against Barry's Beauts December 24.

"It seems very strange to me," said Barry yesterday, commenting upon the discovery of A. A. U. regulations that will prevent the participation of several amateur sprinters in the race program set for Saturday, December 16 at Athletic Park; "that some way can't be found to allow such men as Rice and En Sue to compete with the fleet runners and help out in the entertainment of our visitors. If it can be arranged, I am willing to postpone the races until later on.

"The West Virginia baseball team has requested me to challenge the All-Hawaii team for another game. They are still wondering how it happened that the local men won the last game with no hits against seven for the West Virginia bunch."
