### Things Humming for the Regatta and Chowder Scheduled for November 4.

The Outrigger Club has got down to a boosting program. Yesterday at a meeting of the directorate held at the public service rooms J. R. Galt was placed in charge of the permanent improvements to be made for the big entertainment and Victor S. Clark was placed on the house committee to liven that body up and get some work out of it. About six hundred dollars from the money already in from ticket sales was voted to Mr. Galt to expend on building the new retaining wall and the rethatching of the roof of the big lanai. It was also voted to employ Horomoto, the canoe carpenter, to begin work at once getting the fleet of outriggers ready for the youngsters regatta on the afternoon of November 4. The helpers at the outrigger grounds will begin jacking up the limbs of the big hau tree grove that the chowder for a thousand guests may be given under its umbrageous protection.

The ladies of the Outrigger Club will assist and Mr. Galt was appointed a committee of one to confer with a number of the ladies who are willing to take over the details of the evening entertainment on the fourth. It will probably be a big affair in addition to the chowder.

#### Clark Cup Contest.

On the afternoon of the fourth there will be a regatta for the youngsters of the club and if the surf comes up, at five o'clock the contest for the Clark cups will take place.

Captain Melanphy has agreed to pull off the following races, with the assistance of the youngsters.

2 o'clock—Sailing race.

2:30 o'clock—Board race.

2:45 o'clock—Brothers canoe race.

3 o'clock—Canoe against surfboard race.

3:15 o'clock—One paddle canoe race.

3:30 o'clock—Three paddle race.

4:15 o'clock—Six paddle race.

4:30 o'clock—Girls surfboard race.

4:45 o'clock—Surfboard contest for Clark cup.

5 o'clock—Small canoe surfing contest.

5:30 o'clock—Large canoe surfing contest.

There will also be a girls' canoe race.

Prizes are being arranged for, and a number of the senior members will be on hand to see that the events are pulled off on schedule and that the canoes are all in readiness for the junior crews.

Captain Melanphy will be on his mettle, and the responsibility of the biggest event ever arranged for the youngsters of the Outrigger Club will rest on his shoulders. The youngsters are eager for the contests and will begin practice as soon as the club carpenter puts the canoes into commission. Captain Melanphy will send today to the mountains for a number of iakus and amas for the outriggers, to be cut from the mountain hau.

Dr. Victor Clark, as a member of the house committee, got to work on the grounds of the Outrigger Club yesterday afternoon, and it seems that the motto that has marked the present administration of the house committee is nan. The Outrigger Club members are backing Dr. Clark solidly for a live active reform movement and progressive activity that will count. The club members have subscribed for a thousand tickets for the big entertainment, and if the house committee will now wake up they will go down into their jeans for plenty more of the round silver dollars that are needed for permanent improvements.
