

KAHANAMOKU EXPENSE FUND IS NOW OFFICIALLY OPENED

The Public Service Association places today at the disposal of the committee for raising funds to send Duke Kahanamoku East, desk room and a stenographer.

In addition, it is sending out a request to each of the allied organizations of the public service that they make appropriations.

It is practically certain that the Trail and Mountain Club, the Outrigger Club, the Boy Scouts, the Hands Around the Pacific Club, the 100,000 Club, and possibly the Civic Federation will each contribute a specified sum.

Members of the allied organizations will also be asked to contribute. Francis Bodge, who joined the Trail and Mountain Club as a junior member, has started the ball rolling in that organization with a five-dollar subscription, and Mr. Dickey of the Civic Federation has sent his check for a larger amount. The Trail and Moun-

tain Club will probably make its appropriation today, as will the 100,000 Club. The directors of the Outrigger Club meet Wednesday when the matter will be brought up.
