

DUKE KAHANAMOKU BENEFIT PROGRAM THIS AFTERNOON

Fine Card of Sporting Events Will Be Run Off at Athletic Park Under the Management of Charles Barron

"Now is the time for all good sports, etc."

This is the way that time-honored typewriter exercise might be varied to suit today's sporting proposition, which is the athletic benefit program at Athletic Park to raise money with which to send Duke Kahanamoku and Vincent Genoves to the Mainland to participate in the Olympic championship tryouts next month.

The program is an excellent one, including races and a baseball game between the West Virginia and the All-Hawaii. The program will start promptly at one-fifteen, and under a corps of competent officials will be run off rapidly. These are the officials:

General admission will be 25 cents and grandstand 50 cents. It isn't much, but every little bit helps.

Concerning the meet Barron said last evening:

"I believe the field day is the classiest that could possibly be staged. I want to thank the local and fleet sportsmen for their aid and assistance. I have tried to get the best talent possible in Honolulu. The two baseball

teams that will struggle for the honor of champion of the Islands are the fastest teams here. I ask the public to come and help the Duke fund along."
