

OUTRIGGER CLUB WILL HELP PUBLIC SERVICE

Officers Named at Annual Meeting and Ambitious Plans Made for New Year.

At the annual meeting of the Outrigger Club held yesterday afternoon at the Public Service rooms, it was decided that the club should become permanently a supporting member of the Public Service Association. The board of directors was instructed to take up the matter of entertaining the Cleveland cruisers.

The following officers were elected: President G. H. Tuttle; vice-president, Irwin Spalding; secretary, C. F. Maxwell; treasurer, A. M. Nowell; captain, E. F. Melanphy; chairman of house committee, E. M. Ehrhorn; directors, J. P. Cooke, A. G. Smith and Dr. D. Scudder; house committee, E. M. Ehrhorn, A. C. Linnemann and H. M. von Holt.

The showing of the treasurer was excellent. Whereas the club started out at the beginning of the year with a deficit of \$200, there is now a surplus of \$500, and the prospect of \$2000 in dues for the coming year. A retaining wall has been completed and paid for out of the funds of the last entertainment, and there is still over \$400 in the treasury on this account for further improvements.

President Tuttle intimated that the coming year would be a lively one, and that the captain of the club would have some of the biggest hustling in his life. Mr. Tuttle is also president of the A. A. U., and in his address as secretary he stated that the time had come to take hold of the youngsters of the club and give them the encouragement they are entitled to and deserve as the future backbone of the Outrigger Club. There were about fifty members of the club present, and their action was concerted and unanimous from the beginning to the end of the meeting.
