

# OUTRIGGER CLUB PLANS PROGRESS

On Saturday the Outrigger Club held its annual meeting and unanimously decided to become the eighth supporting member of the Public Service Association, and besides contributing its \$300 a year to give its hearty support to a movement to make Waikiki beach a great tourist asset. captain will have to get busy, the youngsters having sent a delegate down to the annual meeting to request this.

The finances of the club were reported in splendid condition, with \$500 in bank from the last entertainment for permanent improvements, and receipts for as much more paid out for the now completed retaining wall.
