

OUTRIGGER BOYS WILL PATROL WAIKIKI BEACH

The new house committee of the Outrigger Club is making arrangements to patrol the beach at Waikiki, at least while the sailors are in town. Lately many visitors, including officers of the fleet and their wives, have been venturing out beyond the big breakers. Yesterday Elmer Evans of the Outrigger Club went to the rescue of a couple and barely succeeded in bringing in the woman on his board.

It would be difficult to enumerate the lives saved at Waikiki in the past two years by youngsters and their surfboards. Most of the rescues never became matters of common knowledge.

Doctor Ramus will be asked to drill the juniors of the Outrigger Club as to the best methods of saving life with the surfboard, and Scoutmaster James Wilder will be requested to form a beach patrol that will be able to do effective work, and whose members will actually report for duty at specified dates.

An arrangement forbidding those under the influence of liquor from going into the surf is more necessary than a patrol, for as a rule when a drunken man gives up it is silently and without commotion. - Howard Johnson, an Outrigger Club member, who patrolled the beach yesterday, picked up one such man, who staggered into the water and tried to swim out toward the breakers.
