DUKE PLANS RECORD SWIM

NEW YORK, May 23.—Hopes of American swimming enthusiasts for success in the Olympic games have been given a substantial boost by the excellent performances of Duke Kahanamoku, the Hawaiian champion, since he arrived in the East. His record of 1:04 for 110 yards at the University of Pennsylvania yesterday is very close to a world's record.

In the Olympic swimming series this event will be decided in open water, at which style the Hawaiian is without a peer in the world. He hopes to make a new world's record which will stand for all time, and under favorable conditions believes he can go the course in one minute flat.

It is generally conceded that the American Olympic team will be composed of seven swimmers and two divers. H. J. Hebner, Percy McGillivray, J. H. Reilly, Arthur McAleenan, Jr. and George Gaidaid are likely to be chosen to keep the duke company.
