

COMES BACK WITH A CHAMPIONSHIP

Guy Rothwell, one of the charter members of the Outrigger Club and champion amateur swimmer of the Pacific Northwest, returned to Honolulu Wednesday from Vancouver, on the Marama.

The first act of the young amateur swimmer was to renew his membership in the Outrigger Club and pledge his services in renewing the aquatic sports that first made the organization known to the world.

Young Rothwell, after paddling and swimming in the first Outrigger events, was sent with exhibition outrigger canoes to the Alaska Yukon Exposition to show the Coast people something of our surfing sports. The waters of Puget Sound proved too cold for outrigger canoeing, so Rothwell turned his attention to the young swimmers in the Athletic Associations of the Northwest and offered to meet them in the water.

During the year 1910 the young Outrigger representative won two swimming championships in Portland, the 40-yard swim in 212.5 second and the 100-yard race in one-minute and 4 seconds. In the latter race he beat a former Princeton champion who was wearing the colors of the New York Athletic Club.

In 1911, Guy Rothwell beat all competitors in the swimming races held in Seattle during the Potlach festivities, and now holds the championship of the Northwest.

It is probable that a match between Marston Campbell, Jr., the present crack junior swimmer of the Outrigger Club, and Rothwell will be arranged. At any rate, now that he has returned there will be something doing in aquatics among the younger members of the Outrigger Club.
