

PAN-PACIFIC EXHIBIT AT SAN DIEGO NOW ROUNDING INTO SHAPE

Before leaving on the Manna Kea yesterday afternoon, for a visit to Maui, H. P. Wood stated that the success of the Pan-Pacific Exhibit at San Diego now seems assured. Lloyd Childs was offered to maintain a Pan-Pacific restaurant in the center of the building, maintaining for this a band of Hawaiian musicians and singers. The Pan-Pacific Club in Honolulu is arranging for an exhibit of Hawaiian fish, Secretary Penfold, of the San Diego Exposition, offering on behalf of San Diego to provide the supply of sea water necessary to keep the fish in condition.

The Promotion Committee has sent its exhibit to San Diego, where it is now being installed, and the Honolulu Pan-Pacific Club is subscribing a hundred dollars a month for maintenance of the Hawaiian exhibit. The Outrigger Club is sending a couple of canoes to be used in the lagoon beside the Pan-Pacific building, and in these the Hawaiian musicians will be paddled about during moonlight evening's giving concerts.

Alaska, Oregon, Washington, Latin America, New Zealand, Australia and the Philippines have already shipped their exhibits for the Pan-Pacific exhibit; and Mr. Wood states that, as the prettiest and best located of the San Diego Exposition buildings has been given to the Pan-Pacific exhibitors, they will make a supreme effort to make it the big attraction of the 1916 San Diego Exposition.
